#### Review 2015 Mobilization Revenue:

Chief Gillespie advised that the current report has not changed since the last meeting, and a much more in depth report was presented by Captain Long at the Fire District Planning Group. Commissioner Berg shared his thought process in regards to mobilizations and suggested that ECFR take a year off from mobilizations. Commissioner Gianatasio discussed risk vs. gain and equipment wear and agrees that ECFR should take a year off. Commissioner Petty said her stance mirrors Commissioner Gianatasio, and she has concerns. Commissioner Taggart asked if mobilizations could be limited by distance. **Motion by Commissioner** Berg to suspend mobilizations for one year by Commissioner Berg, second by Gianatasio. **Motion Passed**.

#### Proposed WFCA training in March:

Commissioner Martin read correspondence from Mr. Snure regarding his fees to travel to ECFR and present a workshop at Station 91. The board discussed cost comparison and inviting other districts to help offset the cost. **Motion by Commissioner** Martin to move forward with hosting the seminar at ECFR, second by Gianatasio. **Motion Passed.** 

#### Adopt Part Time Candidate List:

#### Consider Hiring New Part-Time Employees:

Chief Gillespie outlined the department's current overtime expenditure and recommended that we hire 3 part time employees to fill current vacancies. Commissioner Petty asked Chief if he expected hiring to alleviate brownouts at station 94, which he affirmed. Captain Troutman explained how the vacancies are affecting coverage and what leads to brownouts at 94. AC Jacobs shared how the proposed staffing should alleviate pressure on the volunteer staff, who have been covering as much as possible. Commissioner Berg asked if lack of shift coverage could be tracked year over year to determine trends. Commissioner Martin suggested that the board could use a projection of sustainability. **Motion by Commissioner** Berg to hire three part time employees, second by Taggart. **Motion Passed**.

# AC Jacobs Report 2-2-2016

Safety Report

Safety Committee meeting was held 1-27-16

Next safety committee meeting, 3-24-16 Sta. 91 7:30 PM.

One reported accident since the last board meeting, back injury while helping lift a patient.

We need to install additional exhaust ducting in the truck bay at sta. 94

### **Replacement Engine Specifications**

In the past our specifications have required larger than standard brakes, greater than standard horsepower, and larger than standard water capacity. The brake and horsepower specifications are needed due to the very hilly terrain in our district, the extra water capacity is needed to provide water until tenders arrive.

There are always stock units on the market, sometimes at lower prices than we would pay for an engine built to our specifications, however purchasing an engine that doesn't meet our needs may create safety and response time issues.

Current price for an engine comparable to our current E91 is approximately \$425,000. Using a standard chassis, International, Freightliner, etc. could save us approximately \$25,000 to \$35,000 however the standard chassis are not designed to handle the added electrical loads required for a fire engine, they are fine for a tender or wildland engine that does not have as much electrical load.

Some pricing examples are attached from the company that has been the low bidder for our newest two engines and our newest two tenders.

#### Report for the 02 February 2016

#### Commissioners' Meeting

Good evening Honorable Chairperson and Members of the Board,

During the last month serving as your Interim Executive Fire Chief we have made significant progress on several areas.

We had a special meeting workshop on Thursday 14 January and discussed a number of important topics. Two topics were updated for the Commission, the air rig and opportunities associated with it and the generator issue at Station 94 and are awaiting a report on these issues.

In addition we discussed streamlining our current stations and fleet. All requested actions by the Commission have begun.

The Commission voted to sell Station 96. They also voted to suspend the Mobilization response from the District for 2016.

The ESCI team has been in contact with Commissioners Taggart and Petty with their progress.

We have the Standard of Coverage for your review and possible adoption. And we have an upcoming Planning Session scheduled for 10 February.
